














Uttarakhand, also known as Devabhoomi— meaning Land of Gods, is home to a remarkable number of Hindu shrines that attract thousands of worshippers around the year. However, the Char Dham Yatra is undoubtedly the most sought after. Char, in Hindi, refers to four, while Dham means a place of religious importance. This holy pilgrimage, also known as the Chhota Char Dham Yatra, is a circuit of four Hindu shrines- Yamunotri, Gangotri, Kedarnath, and Badrinath.

These sites are important destinations for Hindu devotees, and the circuit is considered a sacred journey. The Himalayas are a "junction between worlds that touch and do not touch each other" (Axel Michaels in Hinduism Past and Present). The Sanskrit word 'tirtha' or pilgrimage has just precisely that notion of a crossing place, a transition. And that is why this entire mountain zone is sacred and a place of pilgrimage.

It is not just a journey through these hallowed sites but also an exploration of Uttarakhand's breathtaking landscapes—soaring peaks, lush forests, and sacred rivers. Each destination offers not only spiritual solace but also a deep connection to the natural and divine essence of the Himalayas. However, it is also lined with several challenges and does require meticulous planning.

#### The alarm bells

The Char Dham Yatra is a stark reminder of the impending environmental catastrophe in the Himalayas. Despite their sacred status, these mountains are being ruthlessly exploited in the name of development, leading to severe ecological degradation.

#### **Environmental destruction**

One can witness how in the name of development, there has been relentless spoliation of this sacred space, the scarring of its pristine landscapes, the dispossession of the rarest of the rare birds and animals which have dwelt in its embrace since ancient times and even of human communities which, in their ways of life, traditions and beliefs, have been its most faithful sentinels.

#### Impact of religious tourism

For human despoilers, the sacredness has become an asset to exploit for profit. The Everest has become a high-altitude rubbish heap and its crest one more tick on a bucket list of adventures. Our Char Dham are no longer hallowed places of pilgrimage but flourishing destinations for religious tourism. The surge in religious tourism, with millions of visitors each year, has led to the proliferation of hotels, helicopter services, and other tourist amenities, further straining the environment.



Since the shrines opened around May 10-11, around 950,000 pilgrims had already descended on Gangotri, Badrinath, Kedarnath and Yamunotri. These are staggering numbers for such fragile and sensitive mountain locations.

#### Waste and infrastructure challenge

The sheer volume of waste generated by such large numbers of visitors is staggering. A few years ago, a government study found 23,000 tonnes of solid waste annually along the track to one dham, a figure that has undoubtedly increased. The Char Dham highway, intended to facilitate access, has resulted in frequent landslides and expensive repairs. The upcoming Rishikesh-to-Karnaprayag railway line will likely exacerbate these issues.

#### Unstable terrain and unsustainable development

The Himalayas are inherently unstable, with frequent landslides and avalanches. Large-scale infrastructure projects disturb this delicate balance, leading to natural disasters. Despite laws mandating debris removal, project waste is often dumped on-site, blocking natural drainage and causing environmental havoc.

#### Climate change and future risks

Climate change is accelerating the melting of Himalayan glaciers, compounding the effects of environmental degradation. The cumulative impact of climate change and

reckless development threatens the very existence of these sacred mountains.

#### The need for sustainable practices

While economic activity and development are necessary, they must be balanced with environmental conservation. Careful planning and sustainable practices are essential to protect these fragile ecosystems. Failure to do so will result in greater suffering, particularly for the poorest communities

#### Conclusion


Whatever be the immediate benefit, such mindless ravaging of nature will bring eventual retribution and greater deprivation to people. And one is not even factoring in the adverse effects of global warming, which is already leading to the accelerated melting of the Himalayan glaciers. We are caught in a vicious cumulative dynamic in which climate change and environmental degradation are reinforcing each other. If we do not heed the warning bells ringing across these divine mountains, the temple bells of Char Dham may soon fall silent.

The Himalayas are at a critical juncture. Immediate action is required to preserve their sanctity and ecological balance. Only by heeding the warning bells and implementing sustainable development can we ensure that the sacred bells of Char Dham continue to ring for generations to come.

## Thoughts to Remember

### India Scripts History at 45th Chess Olympiad in Budapest, Hungary

India scripted history as both men's and women's teams secured their first-ever gold medals at the 45th Chess Olympiad in Budapest, Hungary on September 22 (Sunday).

D Gukesh, Arjun Erigaisi and R Praggnanandhaa won their respective matches in the 11th and final round to deliver India a victory in the men's competition. Following the men's team's historic triumph, the women's team—comprising Harika Dronavalli, Vaishali Rameshbabu, Divya Deshmukh, Vantika Agrawal, Tania Sachdev and Abhijit Kunte—clinched the gold medal, sealing a remarkable double victory for India at the Chess Olympiad.

Legendary Viswanathan Anand hailed India's performance at the Chess Olympiad 2024 as the best in the history of the tournament. Anand said that this kind of domination by a country has never been seen before.





## ISRO selects 2 Indian astronauts for ISS mission under Axiom-4

In the spring of 2025, Indian astronaut group captain Shubhanshu Shukla is set to make history as the pilot of the Axiom -4 (Ax-4) mission that will mark India's first human presence on the International Space Station (I SS). His backup - fellow Indian Astronaut, group captain, Prashanth Nair also joins the crew for this mission.

The landmark mission, scheduled for launch from the Kennedy Space Centre in Florida, US, will be India's second govt-sponsored human spaceflight in over four decades- Wing Commander (retd) Rakesh Sharma had gone to space as part of a soviet mission in 1984.

The mission will also help India prepare for its Gaganyaan programme – Isro's first crewed mission – by providing valuable experience in spaceflight operations and international cooperation.



#### Saiyami Kher creates history as she becomes 1<sup>st</sup> Indian female actor to finish Ironman Triathlon in Germany

Bollywood actor Saiyami Kher set a new benchmark by becoming the first Indian female actor to complete the Ironman 70.3 triathlon in Germany. The race consists of a 1.9 km swim, 90 km of cycling, and a 21.1 km run to be completed back-to-back without breaks.

Saiyami Kher has impressed audiences with her portrayal in films like Ghoomer, Sharmaji Ki Beti, Choked and others.

Talking about the journey, Saiyami says that crossing the finish line of the Ironman 70.3 and getting that medal was one of the proudest moments of her life. She adds, training for an Ironman while juggling 12 to 14-hour shooting was tough. There were days when motivation was nowhere to be found, and it really felt like a battle with herself.

Kher highlighted the importance of resilience, stating, "This race has been about losing my way but ultimately finding my path. It showed me the power of determination and how if you put your mind to something, no one can stop you."
